## INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON MULTIFUNCTIONAL MATERIALS (ICMM 2019)

#### December (19-21) -2019

The multi functionality in materials enables many modern applications which can improve quality of life and address many important global challenges. Consequently, the interdisciplinary field has recently extended to computational engineering approaches for virtual material design and even to advanced fabrication schemes considering the advantage of digitalization. This has lead to reinforce the objective of enabling and accelerating the development and manufacture of the products of the future.

Geethanajli College of Engineering and Technology is promoted by Teja Educational Society and was established in the year 2005. As an autonomous college since 2016 and NAAC Accredited with 'A' Grade, N.B.A. Accredited and affiliated to JNTU (H) Hyderabad and AICTE, the college has been making inroads, providing quality technical education.

ICMM-2019, hosted by Geethanjali College of Engineering and Technology has provided a platform to deliberate on technological challenges and development and the role of multifunctional materials in addressing the challenges and accelerating the development. Geethanjali College of Engineering and Technology was instrumental in providing an ideal platform for around 300 participants across the globe (10 countries) to present their papers and exhibit their posters.

Research scholars, academicians from various parts of India and abroad participated in the deliberations and presented their papers and or posters.

Local transport was provided for all the participants from nook and corner of the city. Boarding and Lodging facilities were provided to all the guest.

The plenary sessions and invited talks quenched the thirst of the scholars, students and academicians on various aspects of Multifunctional Materials, their role in developing research in interdisciplinary areas to provide viable solutions to many problems.

Chief Guest of the Inaugural session Dr. Vikas Kumar, Ex-Director, DMRL-DRDO and Guest of Honour, Sri. G. Ranjith Reddy, Minister of Parliament, Chevella Constituency graced the occasion and highlighted the need for organizing this kind of a conference.

Scientists and Academicians from reputed institutions such as University of Tsukuba, Japan, Ryazan State University, Russia, Tokai University, Japan, ARCI-Hyderabad, CSIR-IICT, Hyderabad, IIT-Bombay, University of Hyderabad, to name a few delivered plenary and invited talks. The total number of plenary sessions and Invited Talks were 09 and 05 respectively.

The paper presentation sessions were chaired by eminent academicians and the poster presentations were judged by renowned academicians.

Book of Abstract with ISBN number (978-93-5396-620-1)was released. Published 162 research articles in Scopus indexed AIP Conference Proceedings (122) and IOP Journal of Physics: Conference Series (40). In this, 18 papers are from our college. To promote research culture and encourage in house faculty, the institution has paid the publication fee for these 18 papers, an amount of Rs. 80,000.

Two of our III-year students are appointed as Interns from July, 2019 to Dec, 2019. They were entrusted the responsibility of developing the conference website and to design the necessary conference material. On completion of the internship Rs.5,000/- was paid to each student as a token of encouragement.

Prizes worth Rs.4,000/- for oral presentations and 3,000/- for poster presentations respectively were given to young researchers to encourage their spirit of research. More than 90% of the participants have given 5-star rating or rated the conference as excellent.
